Initial service orders contain the following information:

type of service....., specific service providers that will render services, and client's preferred day and time for service delivery. Comments explain the rationale for ordered services, consumer preference, special instructions...Comments also include consumer health status and <u>discharge plan preferences.</u>

- A thorough discharge plan should include:
 - The Who.....who will be involved
 - The Whatwhat does the client want/need
 - The When.....when might the discharge occur
 - The Where......where does the client want to be
 - The How.....how can we get everything

done (what resources are available)



Honor and support client choice in discharge planning

- Develop the plan
 - At Initial Assessment
- Review and Update the plan
 - At Reassessment and Face to Face Care Plan Reviews



<u>WHO</u>

- who does the client want to assist with this discharge?
- who does the client want to assist with ADLs or IADLs?
- who does the client want to assist with finances?
- who is available to assist?



WHAT

- what does the client need to remain in the community
- what does the family think the client needs
- what referrals are required prior to discharge



WHEN

- when client no longer meets eligibility criteria
- when the cost of the care plan exceeds nursing home costs
- when the client chooses to terminate services



WHERE

- where does the client want to be
 - Near family, with family
 - Specific relative for friend
 - Specific community, town, county
 - Specific nursing home, personal care home
 - Near current physician
 - Transportation accessibility (on a bus line)



HOW

- how can everything get done (implementation)
 - Family member
 - Neighbor
 - Provider
 - Physician
 - Hospital discharge planner



- Discharge Plans should
 - Reflect client capacity
 - Client resources
 - Involve family members
 - Provide referrals



- Aging and Disability Connections
 - Resource data base
 - Non-Medicaid HCBS
 - Private Pay

 - Community and/or churches



- Aging and Disability Connections
 - Area Agencies on Aging
 - Provides information, referral and options counseling
 - Staff is trained to use a statewide data base for resources based on individual needs
 - Staff screen callers telephonically for services using DON-R to determine most in need for wait list management
