What is Medicaid?

 Medicaid is a health insurance program supported with state and federal funds that pays medical bills for eligible low-income families, including: pregnant women and women with breast or cervical cancer, foster and adoptive children, and aged, blind and/or disabled individuals whose income is insufficient to meet the cost of necessary medical services.



State Plan Mandatory & Optional Services

States are not required to participate in the Medicaid program. However, if they do participate, certain services must be covered under the **State Plan**. Others are optional services that states may or may not choose to cover.

Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)

- 1:64 children (ages 0 to 21) in Georgia have Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)
 - 1.1 million children in GA on Medicaid younger than 21 years of age
 - Estimated 17,000 children with Autism Spectrum Disorder enrolled in GA Medicaid
- Spring 2017: Governor's Budget Proposal/Legislative Approval
- Initiated Tri-department Planning Initiative
 - Department of Community Health
 - Department of Public Health
 - Department of Behavioral Health & Developmental Disabilities

FISCAL YEAR 2018 STATE BUDGET HOUSE BILL 44 - FINAL HIGHLIGHTS

House Bill 44, the Fiscal Year 2018 budget, is set by a revenue estimate of \$24.9 billion – an increase of \$1.25 billion, or 5.3%, over the FY 2017 original budget. Of the new revenue, \$775 million (62%) is budgeted for education; \$186 million (15%) is dedicated to transportation; \$128.2 million (10%) is appropriated for public safety agencies; \$128 million (10%) is budgeted for health and human services; and the \$38.8 million (3%) in remaining new funds is appropriated to economic development and general government agencies.

In addition to supporting many of the Governor's recommendations for the FY 2018 budget, the House was able to fund a number of its priorities as well, including:

 Child Welfare – a per diem rate increase for foster parents including those in relative care; additional positions in the Division of Family and Children Services (DFCS) to provide support services for foster parents; additional funding to expand the Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) to advocate on behalf of children; and an hourly rate increase for Special Assistant Attorneys General (SAAGs) who support child welfare cases;

- Military Communities and Service Members providing additional school counselors to school
- systems that serve large military communities to improve outcomes for children of military families;
- additional scholarships for Georgia National Guard members; and additional positions to support veterans including a coordinator to support female veterans; and
- Rural Communities expanding the loan repayment programs for physician assistants, advanced

practice registered nurses, and dentists practicing in rural and underserved areas; providing a \$500 add-on payment for newborn deliveries in rural counties; the creation of four new Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs); and maintaining current funding levels for the Georgia Rural Water Association and Regional Conservation Districts.

Additional highlights of the budget are as follows:

Economic Development

- HB 44 provides \$393,182 in new state funds and \$55,055 in existing funds within the Department of Agriculture to provide for 11 food safety, plant, and animal industry positions to address increased The General Assembly restored \$100,000 in funds for the Coastal Regional Commission of Georgia to . provide grants for infrastructure and further the development of the coastal greenway. Oversight Agencies

- Beginning in State Fiscal Year 2018, the legislature aligned funds for services and supports to individuals with ASD), ages 0 through 20.
- The three state agencies named below were charged with enhancing the state's capacity to support individuals with ASD and their families/caregivers through several initiatives.





- The Georgia Department of Community Health (DCH) is offering an outpatient treatment benefit specific to ASD for Medicaid recipients ages 0 through 20.
- Services are called Adaptive Behavior Services (ABS) and include adaptive behavior treatment including social skills groups.

Finding an Enrolled Provider in GAMMIS

- 1. Member Information tab, select "Find a Provider"
- 2. Enter City, State and Zip Code
- 3. Enter HomeAddress
- 4. Modify the radius of services to maximize the list of providers
- 5. Select the appropriate provider
 - "Medical Services" This will generate a list of non-CSB ABS outpatient providers.
 - "Home/Community Based Services" This will generate a list of <u>all</u> Community Service Boards (CSBs) and their office locations. Select "Autism Spectrum Disorder"
- 6. County Leave blank. Results are more accurate if left unselected.

Narrow results by including more values under the Provider Information section.

- If looking for a specific provider, enter the provider's name in the "Provider Business OR Last Name" field. If unsure of the spelling use the checkbox below the
 name and the search will find provider names that start with the same sounds as the value entered in the "Provider Business OR Last Name" field.
- Enter all or part of the member's address and select the mile radius to ensure the search results are within the specific distance.
 You may search for providers accommodating one or more special needs. Multiple selections can be made by holding the CTRL key and left-clicking on the
- tou may search for providers accommodating one or more spectal needs. Multiple selections can be made by holding the CTRL key and left-clicking on the desired values. (Macintosh users should hold the COMMAND key while choosing multiple values.)



ASD Services

ASD Adaptive Behavior Services (ABS) Outpatient Benefit

- ABS and other ASD services do **not** require a NOW/COMP waiver.
- ABS are available through age 20
 - IDEA supports are for ages through 21
- ABS services are available to <u>Medicaid recipients only</u>.
 - ABD Medicaid
 - CHIP/LIM Medicaid (Georgia Families and Georgia Families 360)
 - If an individual does not have Medicaid, a GAMMIS search for ABSproviders is recommended to identify enrolled practitioners who may accept other forms of payment and insurance.



ASD Services

ASD Adaptive Behavior Services (ABS) Outpatient Benefit

- Managed by the Department of Community Health
 - Ages 0-20
 - Valid and verified ASD diagnosis required
 - Services must meet medical necessity
 - Prior Authorization for services is required
 - Authorizations are in 6-month increments
 - Range of practitioners can provide services
 - Reimbursement is based on the level of education/qualifications of the practitioners (i.e. U1 U5)
 - Services can be provided via telemedicine (i.e. GT modifier)
 - Services can be provided either in-clinic or out-of-clinic (homes, etc.) (i.e. U6 U7)

Sample of Frequently Asked Questions from DCH Website

Effective January 1, 2018, Georgia's Medicaid Program will begin providing coverage for Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) services. Adaptive Behavior Services (ABS) to assess and treat ASD will be covered for Medicaid eligible members under age twenty-one. Pursuant to the Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment (EPSDT) benefit, coverage is provided for an array of assessment and treatment services according to severity and based on medical necessity. Members must have a documented DSM-V diagnosis of ASD from a licensed physician or licensed psychologist to be eligible for ABS.

1. Who can diagnose a child with ASD?

 A licensed physician, psychologist, or other licensed professional as designated by the Medical Composite Board in order to perform a behavioral assessment and develop a resulting Plan of Care may diagnose a child with autism spectrum disorders (ASD) in accordance with the DSM-V for the child to be eligible for adaptive behavior services.

2. What is the process of receiving autism services?

Once the child receives an ASD diagnosis, an enrolled and qualified health care professional (QHCP) for ABA services must request prior approval (PA) through Alliant/GMCF to perform a behavioral assessment.QHCPs include licensed physicians, licensed psychologists, and/or Board Certified Behavioral Analysts (BCBA or BCBA-D). A separate PAis required for ABS treatment according to the Plan of Care. A follow-up assessment must be completed every six months thereafter for the child to continue to receive services.




